[On July 14th](#), primary elections will nominate party candidates for the U.S. Senate, U.S. Congress, Maine State Senate, and Maine State House.

You must be enrolled in a political party to vote in that party's primary election, which will be done by [ranked choice voting](#).

There will also be a ballot for [two bond questions](#).
