Suffragists in Maine adopted the daffodil as their flower symbol. As a tribute to their historic victory, Mainers planted thousands of daffodil bulbs last fall to commemorate the 100th anniversary, creating a beautiful, renewable memorial to the suffragists and the ideal of equality for all.

And now, in their honor, we must VOTE

The best way to ensure your vote is to request an absentee ballot.

On July 14th, primary elections will nominate party candidates for the U.S. Senate, U.S. Congress, Maine State Senate, and Maine State House.

You must be enrolled in a political party to vote in that party's primary election, which will be done by <u>ranked choice voting</u>.

There will also be a ballot for two bond questions.
